

Yarrow Water Users, as we welcome everyone into 2025, we are celebrating our 81st year of operation. Our community water system began on March 23, 1944. As the cold weather has

arrived, please remember to insulate your outside taps & yard hydrants to prevent freezing and unwanted water leaks.

We invite anyone who would like their water bills emailed to please contact the office by mail (office@yarrowwd.ca) or phone (604-823-6015) as we transition from mailed water bills to emailed bills. We have nearly 25% of our accounts now receiving emailed bills but

would like to increase this total. A reminder to eTransfer payers to please update our email address to the new 2023 address (office@yarrowwd.ca).

As we dream about Spring, warmer weather & outdoor gardening, here's a reminder to please report any fire hydrant use to us ASAP. The only people authorized to use a fire hydrant are the Fire Dept & Waterworks staff. Contractors must have pre-arranged approval & a backflow device must be installed on the hydrant to protect our water system. Illegal hydrant use can compromise our water quality & fire hydrant protection availability for our fire department during required use.

Once we have our 2024 Audit compet-

ed, we'll be able to set a date for our 81st AGM, we are planning to hold it in late April-mid May. We currently have 2 trustee positions due for election for a 3 year term. We have received 3 nominations. Current trustees John McAuley & Jake Toews are both letting their names stand for re-election.





From Minutes of Chilliwack Parks and Trails Advisory Committee Meeting – November 26, 2024 Presentation by Kara Jefford, Director of Engineering, City of Chilliwack

Vedder Greenway Pedestrian Crossing Bridge Update

A presentation update on the Vedder River Trail Bridge was given by Kara Jefford, Director of Engineering. Designed for pedestrians and cyclists, the concept of the Vedder Greenway Pedestrian Crossing Bridge first originated in 2018. The stand-alone bridge is intended to be a 67m Single Span Steel Arch bridge with a concrete bridge deck and a 3m wide bridge deck surface. The preferred location of this trail bridge is the Browne Creek Crossing near Bergman Rd and Hooge Rd, as this is where the river is the narrowest.

Although money was received from Trans Mountain for the completion of the project, there have been multiple setbacks in acquiring the approval to build the bridge, including determining the best location for the bridge. The notion to begin the construction of the Vedder River Trail bridge was first completed in June 2018 with a technical evaluation. The next task of a Geotechnical Report was not accomplished until March 2021, consisting of a Load Evaluation on Bergman Bridge (for drill rig access) and

a Heritage Investigation Permit, which was granted in February 2021.

In March 2023 staff began the preliminary design, which included determining the recommended structural built form, recommendations for environmental and other approvals, as well as, constructability advice from a bridge contractor and an updated cost estimate. In 2024, with a budget of \$4.75 million, a Provincial Land Tenure Application was submitted in October. This application has a timeline of 2 – 3 years and includes a Crown Land Management Plan, hydraulic assessment, preliminary design and any supporting documentation.

Consultation with First Nations through Stó:lō was submitted in October. Water Sustainability Act authorizations can be submitted once the Crown Land Application process is completed and Tenure is approved. Unfortunately, this means no other applications may move forward until Crown Land Tenure is granted, meaning that something like environmental approvals cannot be completed in advance.

Once Tenure is approved the next steps will be Water Sustainability Act authorization, DFO Letter of Advice, Submission to Transport Canada under the Navigable Waters Act, an updated cost estimate, and grant applications for active transportation and recreation for a design -build tentative in 2028- 29.

In 2018 the City also engaged with a consultant to review the feasibility of a cantilevered bridge on the Southern Railway train bridge, including a structural review. The consultant recommended a new independent pedestrian bridge be built due to the extensive work required as the current bridge does not have the proper loading capacity and would cause impacts to trail traffic. Alternatively, in 2024 the City began preliminary talks with Southern Railway regarding the cost and timeline of building an independent bridge that could work while waiting for a response on the Crown Land Tenure.



In 2008, the "Made in Canada" versus "Product of Canada" distinction was created to help consumers and highlight businesses that are achieving that 98 per cent threshold.
